



STOP and Report

Illinois Department of Public Health Reportable Diseases

Mandated reporters, such as all health care providers, hospitals and laboratories, must report any suspected or confirmed human cases of these diseases to the local health authority within the number of days or hours indicated in parenthesis. (HIV/AIDS is reportable directly to IDPH)

Any suspected bioterrorist threat or event (**immediate**)
Any unusual case of a Disease or Condition by an infectious Agent not listed in the part that is of Urgent Public Health Significance (**immediate**)

Arboviral Diseases (including, but not limited to, Chikungunya fever, Dengue fever, St. Louis Encephalitis, WNV, California Encephalitis)

Botulism, foodborne (**immediate**)

Botulism, infant, wound, other (24h)

Brucellosis (24h, unless bioterrorism suspected, then **immediate**)

Chickenpox (24h)

Cholera (24h)

Creutzfeldt-Jakob Disease

Q fever (24h, unless bioterrorism suspected then **immediate**)

Rabies, human and potential human exposure and Animal Bites (24h)

Reye syndrome

Rocky Mountain spotted fever

Rubella (24h)

Salmonellosis, other than typhoid

Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome (SARS) (**immediate**)

Shigellosis

Smallpox (**immediate**)

Smallpox vaccination, complications (24h)

S. aureus, Methicillin resistant (MRSA) clusters in a community setting or colonization/infection in infants <61 days (24h)

S. aureus infections with intermediate or high level resistance to vancomycin (24h)

Streptococcal infections, Group A, invasive and sequelae to Group A streptococcal infections (24h)

S. pneumoniae, invasive in those <5 yrs

Syphilis

Tetanus

Toxic shock syndrome due to S. aureus

Trichinosis

Tuberculosis

Tularemia (24h, unless bioterrorism then **immediate**)

Typhoid fever (24h)

Typhus (24h)

Vibriosis (non cholera)
