The Champaign County Public Health Department was formed by a referendum of county voters in 1996 to bring many of the same public health services to Champaign County residents living outside C-U.

These agencies together provide a host of vital services to all county residents. Public Health services include: community health nursing; dental care for children; environmental health inspections and permits; disease tracking and reporting; HIV counseling and testing, prevention and management; sexually transmitted disease testing and treatment; immunizations and an array of other services to pregnant women, children, teenagers and adults of all ages.

# Division of Infectious Disease Prevention and Management - Anonymous HIV Testing

In 2005, CUPHD saw a total of 375 clients in Counseling and Testing Services. 244 were from Champaign or Urbana, 45 from Champaign County. 48% were with persons who identified as Men who have Sex with Men (MSM), 6% reported Injection Drug Using (IDU) behaviors, and 15% reported High Risk Heterosexual (HRH) behaviors (Sex with HIV+ person, Females who reported sex with MSM, Sex with IDU, 2 or more STD in past 12 months, or Sex Workers). 70% of those receiving Anonymous Counseling and Testing services reported an increased risk of HIV infection.

### **Hepatitis Integration Project**

333 people were tested and/or vaccinated for Hepatitis A, B, & C.
