**BOARD OF HEALTH
Special Meeting & Study Session
September 29, 2010**

On September 29, 2010, the Board of Health of the Champaign-Urbana Public Health District (CUPHD) held a Special Meeting and Study Session at 201 W. Kenyon, Champaign, Illinois. Ms. Carol Elliott called the Special Meeting to order at 9:42 AM. Upon roll call, the following board members were found to be present: Ms. Carol Elliott, Chair, Mr. Pius Weibel, Secretary, and Ms. Pam Borowski.

Ms. Andrea Wallace received a renewal agreement between CUPHD and PAETEC for phone services. The renewal agreement contained a discrepancy with the contract date. The master agreement was a 36-month agreement beginning January 2007 and ending February 2010. Ms. Pam Borowski made a motion to approve the contract renewal between CUPHD and PAETEC pending a review and approval of the contract by Attorney, Fred Grosser, and Ms. Wallace. Mr. Pius Weibel seconded the motion. With all in favor, the motion carried.

With no further business to be discussed, Ms. Carol Elliott adjourned the meeting at 9:53 AM.

Study Session

Immediately following, Ms. Carol Elliott called the Study Session to order at 9:54 AM. Upon roll call, the following board members were found to be present: Ms. Carol Elliott, Chair, and Mr. Pius Weibel, Secretary, and Ms. Pam Borowski.

Public Participation – None.

Ms. Julie Pryde reported that CUPHD will be testing the emergency response system via upcoming flu clinics. On October 6, 2010, flu clinics will be held at sites in Champaign, Urbana, Rantoul, and Tolono. The Tolono clinic is a drive-thru clinic and all others are walk-in clinics. On October 7, 2010, CUPHD will hold a walk-in clinic at the 201 W. Kenyon Road facility in Champaign. The vaccine is for adults only; the children's vaccine is not available at this time.

Mr. Jim Roberts gave an update regarding the West Nile virus Surveillance and *Culex* Mosquito Abatement program. The State of Illinois reported twenty-nine (29) counties had at least one (1) positive bird or mosquito

sample, eighteen (18) human cases of WNV, and one (1) death. There have also been fifty-two (52) positive birds and 2,040 positive mosquito samples in Illinois. Champaign County has had four (4) positive birds and fifteen (15) positive mosquito samples. Surveillance of birds and mosquitoes is complete.

The mosquito abatement program is also complete. Mr. Roberts would like to get feedback from the Cities of Champaign and Urbana and the Village of Savoy about the program and to move forward with the process for 2011. Mr. Roberts would like to look at the option of expanding the program; additional potential partners could include the Village of Rantoul, the Champaign & Urbana Park Districts, and the University of Illinois. The U.S. EPA has new requirements for dispensing pesticides in U.S. water systems that will need to be met by April 11, 2011. With new changes going to be in effect, Mr. Roberts would like to look at a multi-year agreement as a possibility with the Public Works departments.

Mr. Roberts reported food rule books are now available on CD for new and existing food establishments. Paper copies are available upon request. CDs will be provided to the City Clerk's offices and the public libraries. The food rule book is available on-line and is searchable.

Mr. Roberts will research the current cost of producing paper copies of the food rule book. The book is 127 pages and is 2-sided.

The next monthly meeting will be rescheduled to October 18, 2010 at 4:30 PM and the next study session will be held on October 27, 2010 at 9:30 AM.

With no further business to be discussed, Ms. Carol Elliott adjourned the meeting at 10:17 AM.
