#### **TIMES Center**

Staff from the Division of Infectious Disease Prevention & Management is present at the TIMES Center from 7-7:30 am on Monday mornings to conduct TB Skin Testing and Wednesday mornings form 7-7:30 am to read the skin testing.

During the month of March, **12 clients** were TB Skin Tested.

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#### **Stepping Stones, Salvation Army**

Staff from the Division of Infectious Disease Prevention & Management is present at the TIMES Center from 7:30-8 am on Monday mornings to conduct TB Skin Testing and Wednesday mornings form 7:30-8am to read the skin testing.

In March, **4 clients** received TB Skin Testing.

### Center for Women in Transition/ A Women's Fund

Staff from the Division of Infectious Disease Prevention & offer TB skin testing to residents at CWIT/AWF, as needed.

During the month of March, 2 received TB Skin Testing.

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### Jail Project: *Check Out Healthy*

The Illinois Department of Public Health will not be funding "Check Out Healthy" in SFY 2012 as it has for the past several years. CUPHD management has decided to continue this much needed service as many clients have tested positive for Chlamydia through this project. All inmates who meet the IDPH screening criteria will be offered urine-based testing for gonorrhea and Chlamydia. All inmates who meet screening criteria for HIV testing will be offered testing through the HIV testing program. HIV testing is reported above. All inmates will continue to be screened for syphilis.

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### Juvenile Detention Center Outreach

Staff from CUPHD provides STD skill-based prevention education at the Champaign County Juvenile Detention Center at least one time each month. Urine screening for Chlamydia & Gonorrhea is offered to all of the youth.

In March, **12 clients** were tested for gonorrhea & Chlamydia. 2 client tested positive this month for Chlamydia and 2 for gonorrhea.

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### Pregnancy Screening Project

**0 women** were tested for Gonorrhea and Chlamydia when seeking Pregnancy testing in March. Of those testing, 0 (0%) was positive for Chlamydia and 0 (0%) were positive for gonorrhea.

CUPHD is collaborating with the Douglas County Health Department, through a grant provided by IDPH, Center for Minority Health Services. DCHD is providing school-based clinics from the CUPHD mobile weekly.

CUPHD collaborated with the UP Center of Champaign County (LGBT Agency) to provide HIV testing for a special event. One person received rapid HIV testing.

CUPHD hosted the statewide Center for Minority Health Services Mobile Roundup this month. In addition to educational presentations and program planning, the mobiles went to the soup kitchen and to Washington Square to promote WOW services. Three clients received HIV and syphilis testing. Three had their blood pressure checked and two had a prostate cancer screening tests.
