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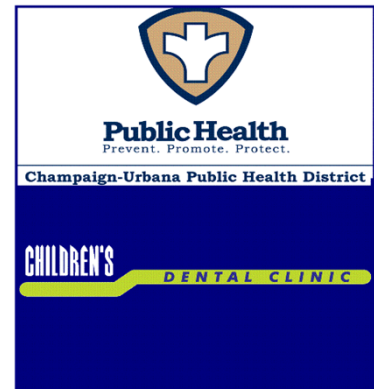
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CUPHD Dental Program

Champaign-Urbana Public Health District's Champaign Dental Clinic provides a Dental Home for children with All Kids who are residents of Champaign or Urbana. Appointments are available Monday - Friday, 8am - 4pm with Emergency and Urgent Care appointments also available. Parents are encouraged to schedule dental visits after their child's first birthday.

The clinic is staffed by a dentist and 2 hygienists, however, beginning February 1st the patient case load required that we increase to 2 dentists on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

A tobacco sales compliance program. We notify all tobacco vendors that we will check for compliance. After we test the stores, we send congratulatory letters if they pass, as well as notices of failure. This is in cooperation with local law enforcement. Vendors are checked for compliance 3 times per year.

Freedom From Smoking

A 7-week, 8 session class that focuses on giving people who want to quit tools for success. Before the participants quit, they look at their habit and reasons for wanting to be smoke-free. Then, they develop an individual plan to quit. Additional assistance can be obtained from the Illinois Tobacco Quitline, including patches for those who qualify.

Events

We attended two meetings with the Edge of Mall tenant group, and presented on smoke-free housing to the Urbana City Council during public comment.

We held a CATCH Family Match Night at Wiley. Twenty kids and twenty parents showed up to play physically active games with age appropriate math problems.

The Green Machine, Unity West's Youth Wellness Council met three times, 11 members attended.

We held a Lucky Tray Day at Lincoln Trail Elementary that included the entire school, 664 students.

We attended Family Fun Night at Unity West. Families competed against each other on Just Dance. There were 375 attendees.

We held Fitness Friday at Martin Luther King Jr Elementary School. All the students got some structured physical activity during recess. 303 students participated.

We held Lucky Tray Day at Ludlow Elementary that included the entire school, 111 students.

Illinois Breast & Cervical Cancer Program (IBCCP)

IBCCP contracts with local medical providers to provide free breast and cervical cancer screening for Illinois women ages 35-64 with no health insurance, Medicaid, or Medicare part B. The CUPHD IBCCP serves women from Champaign, McLean and Vermilion Counties. CUPHD IBCCP provides community outreach as well as educational materials and presentations throughout our service area to encourage all women to have their annual screenings done and to seek new client enrollment in order to provide uninsured screenings for women who would otherwise have no access to these services. Approximately 40% of the screening tests yield abnormal results requiring IBCCP medical case management and diagnostics services. While women under the age of 35 are not eligible for screening through this program, they may be eligible for medically indicated diagnostic services if referred by their medical provider. If diagnosed, eligible women are transferred into Medicaid for cancer treatment.

Many women have been discharged from IBCCP due to Medicaid coverage through the Affordable Care Act.

As a result, IBCCP has started an outreach campaign to increase awareness about IBCCP and to seek uninsured women for enrollment. Outreach letters were mailed to all churches in Champaign, McLean, and Vermilion Counties, and to some food pantries and social service agencies in order to increase awareness in the community.

IBCCP ads were also started in LaPrensa Newspaper and Mundo Magazine. Both of these publications target Latina women throughout this region. Many of these women are uninsured and would be eligible for IBCCP screenings and diagnostic services.

40,970 women died last year from breast cancer.

1 in 8 women will be diagnosed with breast cancer sometime in their lives.
