Mobile Program/School Sealants

January: Visited 3 Schools - 202 Exams, 80 Cleanings, 79 Fluorides, 157 Sealants placed.
 February: Visited 5 Schools - 193 Exams, 85 Cleanings, 84 Fluorides, 143 Sealants placed.
 March: Visited 4 Schools - 124 Exams, 56 Cleanings, 56 Fluorides, 13 Sealants placed.
 April: Visited 3 Schools - 148 Exams, 78 Cleanings, 77 Fluorides, 151 Sealants placed.

The School Sealant Program does not see patients during the months of May, June, July and August.

September: Visited 3 Schools - 181 Exams, 82 Cleanings, 102 Fluorides, 143 Sealants placed.

Illinois Breast & Cervical Cancer Program (IBCCP)

IBCCP contracts with local medical providers to provide free breast and cervical cancer screening for Illinois women ages 35-64 with no health insurance, Medicaid, or Medicare part B. The CUPHD IBCCP serves women from Champaign, McLean and Vermilion Counties. CUPHD IBCCP provides community outreach as well as educational materials and presentations throughout our service area to encourage all women to have their annual screenings done and to seek new client enrollment in order to provide uninsured screenings for women who would otherwise have no access to these services. Approximately 40% of the screening tests yield abnormal results requiring IBCCP medical case management and diagnostics services. While women under the age of 35 are not eligible for screening through this program, they may be eligible for medically indicated diagnostic services if referred by their medical provider. If diagnosed, eligible women are transferred into Medicaid for cancer treatment.

October 2016

IBCCP participated in the CU American Cancer Society walk by providing an educational booth with breast and cervical health information. We attended 2 church health fairs in Champaign, where we discussed our program to women in attendance. IBCCP gave a presentation at a breast cancer lunch and learn for 30 women. In Peoria, we attended the OSF women's lifestyle show at the Peoria Civic Center and spoke with 500 women about our services. We continue to focus on transitioning PMW clients into our caseload.

The number of active IBCCP clients continues to increase in all counties except Vermilion where the majority of clients transferred to Medicaid. Despite an increase in active clients, new enrollment decreased this month. This may be explained by an increase in women that received IBCCP services in the past and are being counted as reenrolled clients rather than new clients. We are discharging fewer than 5 women a month to Medicaid/ACA.
