SPECIAL EVENTS: Staff conducted Rapid HIV Testing for National Black Testing Day during the week of February 4, 2008. Testing was conducted at Eastern Illinois University and University of Illinois, Cultural Center. 80 persons participated in these activities. Staff conducted Rapid HIV Testing on February 23, 2008, for the “Midwest Bisexual, Lesbian, Gay, Transgender, Ally College Conference” at the University of Illinois. 26 persons participated.

Jail Project: Check Out Healthy

Check Out Healthy is a collaborative effort between the Champaign County Correctional Facility and The Division of HIV/STD/TB Prevention & Management. "Check Out Healthy" is a transitional Case Management Program that offers pre-release support, free communicable disease screening, and discharge planning. The program is offered to all inmates who are HIV+, and those at an increased risk for becoming HIV+ who are housed at the Champaign County Correctional Centers.

"Check Out Healthy" offers all Champaign County Correctional Center inmates a brief, risk behavior assessment. Those identified as being at an increased risk for becoming infected with HIV (men who have sex with men, injection drug users, persons who use crack, methamphetamines, or heroin, persons who are homeless, persons who trade sex for money, drugs, or basic needs, and persons who are victims of domestic violence) will be offered free discharge planning services with referrals to the following community resources:

1. Prevention case management for risk behavior change
2. Housing resources
3. HIV case management
4. Health care
5. Mental Health Services
6. Harm Reduction Services

7. Substance Abuse Treatment/support
8. Methadone Maintenance Therapy
9. Support Groups
10. Domestic Violence Services
11. Employment resources
12. Educational programs

All inmates will be offered the following free communicable disease screening services provided by Champaign-Urbana Public Health District:

1. Urine testing for Chlamydia & gonorrhea
2. A blood test for:
 - a. Syphilis
 - b. HIV
 - c. Hepatitis C (for persons with history of injection drug use)
3. Vaccination for Hepatitis A & B (for persons with Hepatitis C or males with a history of sex with males).

Pregnancy Screening Project

25 women were tested for Gonorrhea and Chlamydia when seeking Pregnancy testing in February. Of those testing, 0 (0%) were positive for Chlamydia and 0 (0%) was positive for gonorrhea.

TIMES Center

Staff from the Division of Infectious Disease Prevention & Management is present at the TIMES Center from 7-8 am on Monday mornings. During the month of February, 17 clients sought services (including TB Skin Testing). No clients received HIV/STD testing. No one received blood pressure testing. No persons received condom packs. No persons received flu vaccinations.

Prostate Screening Project

During the month of February, 17 men over 40 years old were screened through a blood test for Prostate Cancer. Staff conducted these tests through the STD Clinics and mobile outreach projects.

Juvenile Detention Center Outreach

Staff from CUPHD provides STD skill-based prevention education at the Champaign County JDC at least one time each month. Urine screening for Chlamydia & Gonorrhea is offered to all of the youth. In February, 7 clients were tested for gonorrhea & Chlamydia. 2 clients tested positive this month for Chlamydia and 0 for gonorrhea. Of those testing, 7 were African-American, 0 White. 3 were male and 4 female.

Teen Wellness on Wheels (Champaign High Schools)

During the month of February, 3 youth sought services on the mobile unit during one outreach sessions (three sessions were cancelled due to inclement weather) (0 females and 3 males). No students were tested for gonorrhea and Chlamydia. No students received HIV testing and no students received syphilis testing. No females sought a pregnancy test and 3 students received safer sex kits. All clients receiving condoms were given risk reduction counseling.

Wellness on Wheels (Homeless Outreach)

Starting the beginning of January, *Wellness on Wheels* will be using the smaller CUPDH mobile to deliver community services. The collaboration with Carle Foundation will be limited to special events. WOW is parked outside of Catholic Worker House each Friday from 11-1pm.

69 clients were seen in February, 52 males and 17 females. 14 were White, 55 African American, 0 Native American, 0 Asian, and 0 Hispanic.

CUPHD Mobile (Community Outreach)

CUPHD expanded mobile services with a new mobile this summer. In January, services were delivered to clients in Ivanhoe Estates, Joanne Dorsey, Dobbins Downs, Restoration Urban Ministries, Garden Village, Prairie Green Apartments, and Scottswood. The mobile is taken to these areas between 3 and 5pm on Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays. In January, several new sites were added to this mobile's site rotation. These sites include: In Rantoul, Heritage Estates, Cherry Orchard Village, Abbott Acres, Falcon Way, Madison Village, and Fountain Valley. Sites in Ludlow, Seymour, Mahomet (Candlewood Estates), and Tolono have also been added.

56 clients were seen in February, 25 males and 31 females. 32 were White, 23 African American, 0 Native American, 0 Asian, 0 Hispanic, 1 Other. Services were limited to the first two weeks of the month due to staffing.

Senior Outreach in Champaign-Urbana: CUPHD began providing outreach education and risk reduction services to persons over 50 years old in January 2008. This outreach focuses on educating persons over 50 years old on the signs and symptoms of Sexually Transmitted Diseases and the importance of receiving routine STD testing. Condom distribution is a part of this outreach. In February, staff presented information and risk reduction supplies to residents in Skelton Place. Flyers about CUPHD services were placed in common areas of the high-rise.
