**The CUPHD Diabetes Program** is funded in part by the Illinois Diabetes Prevention and Control Program (IDPCP) with a grant from the Center for Disease Control .In cooperation with U of I Extension Services a bimonthly newsletter is sent out to person with pre-diabetes or diabetes who have enrolled in the diabetes program. The statistics from their enrollment and yearly reviews help to form the picture of diabetes care in Champaign County, the state and the nation.

### Special Events

**Health Fair /Events:** There were two health fairs we participated in with a total of 135 attending.

**Diabetes Outreach meetings** (2) took place at Round Barn Senior Hi-Rise and Washington Square with 19 people in attendance. Themes for discussion were portion control and carbohydrates highlighted by a pizza serving, hypo/hyperglycemia concerns with special emphasis on the heart effects with low blood glucose, blood glucose targets before,during and after exercise, and annual kidney testing and information in relation to diabetes.

**Surveys** were sent out to participants in the Illinois Diabetes Prevention and Control Program to review their diabetes care. 240 were sent out, and 91 were returned.

**Community Home Nursing Program** offers a skilled nurses assessment and disease management for patients with Diabetes, Hypertension, Coronary Artery Disease, Glaucoma, Cancer, Pain Management, Nutritional, Medication Management and Client Centered education related to disease processes and management.

## Tobacco Programs

**Project TNT** is a 10 session program delivered in 5th grade classes. This program is different from most tobacco education curriculums in that it focuses on changing normative beliefs about the prevalence of tobacco use. Further, instead of just giving participants reasons not to use tobacco, it equips participants with decision-making skills as well as effective communication skills.

**Break the Habit** is a partnership between the Illinois Tobacco Quitline and CUPHD. People interested in quitting can call the Quitline and get individual phone counseling from Addictions Specialists, and CUPHD issues nicotine patches based on what the Addictions Specialists suggests.

**Freedom from Smoking** is a 7-week, 8 session class that focuses on giving people who want to quit tools for success. Before the participants quit, they look at their habit, and reasons for wanting to be smoke-free, and develop an individual plan to quit. Patches are offered with this program.

**NOT HERE** is a tobacco sales compliance program. We notify all tobacco vendors that we will check for compliance. After we test the stores, we send congratulatory letters if they pass. We forward those who fail on to law enforcement, who does an official check for compliance. 3 times a year

**Champaign Urbana Public Health District's (CUPHD) Vision Cooperative** offers eye exams and eye glasses to people who have Illinois Public Aid as their insurance. CUPHD Vision Cooperative staff act as the gatekeeper to a coalition of area optometrists and an ophthalmologist who have offered to be a part of this great program. By calling the Lens Line (217-531-5367) a person can receive access to an eye exam by one of the participating licensed eye professional provider and access to the CUPHD eye glass program.

Once a person receives an eye exam and a prescription for eye glasses, the Vision Cooperative schedules the person for eye glass fitting and selection. CUPHD has a wide selection of 49 different eye glass frames that are available in different colors. CUPHD Vision Cooperative is able to bill Illinois Public Aid for the eye glasses and lenses; therefore there is no cost to the client for the eye glass frames and lenses.

**Illinois Breast and Cervical Cancer (IBCCP)** contracts with local medical providers to provide free breast and cervical cancer screening for Illinois women ages 35-64 with no health insurance, Medicaid, or Medicare part B. The CUPHD IBCCP serves women from Champaign, McLean and Vermilion Counties. CUPHD IBCCP provides community outreach as well as educational materials and presentations throughout our service area to encourage all women to have their annual screenings done and to seek new client enrollment in order to provide uninsured screenings for women who would otherwise have no access to these services. Approximately 40% of the screening tests yield abnormal results requiring IBCCP medical case management and diagnostics services. While women under the age of 35 are not eligible for screening through this program, they may be eligible for medically indicated diagnostic services if referred by their medical provider. If diagnosed, eligible women are transferred into Medicaid for cancer treatment.
