



Dental Intern, Rajpaul Singh, participated at a Community Wellness Fair at the ARC on the University of Illinois campus and offered information about CUPHD's dental programs, brushing instruction, and free children's toothbrushes. Over 3,000 people attending the event on September 25th.

Fluoride Varnish Program

- The Champaign-Urbana Public Health District's Dental Clinic Fluoride Varnish Program is for children age 0-35 months who are enrolled in Champaign-Urbana Public Health District's Maternal & Child Health Program
- The Fluoride Clinic is located in the Private Dental Office located next to the Vision Clinic and clients are seen on a walk-in basis, but must present the child's current medical card and the parent or legal guardian's photo ID to receive the service.
- Michelle Kramer, RDH evaluates children's teeth and oral health habits to determine if fluoride varnish is advisable. Fluoride varnish is applied at the same visit once the dentist has performed an exam.
- Parents are shown how to care for their child's teeth and gums and are provided with an age-appropriate toothbrush.
- What is fluoride varnish? Fluoride varnish is a protective coating that is painted on the surfaces of teeth to prevent new cavities from forming and to help stop cavities that have already started.
- What does fluoride varnish do? Fluoride Varnish strengthens teeth. The stronger the teeth are, the less chance that the child will get cavities.
- Is fluoride varnish safe? Yes, fluoride varnish can be used on babies' teeth. It's safe because it adheres to the teeth and only a small amount of fluoride is needed, so very little is swallowed.
- How is fluoride varnish put on the teeth? The varnish is painted on the teeth (just like nail polish is painted on nails). The varnish does not taste bad and can be applied quickly and easily. Your child may cry because young children do not like having things put in their mouth, but the varnish goes on very quickly and the hygienist will also show the parent how to clean their child's teeth and gums.
- How long does the effect of the fluoride varnish last? The protective effect of the fluoride varnish will continue to work for several months. After the fluoride varnish is painted on, the teeth will be slightly yellow and should not be brushed until the next day. The yellow color will come off when the teeth are brushed, but the fluoride will still be protecting the teeth.

Patients without All Kids are encouraged to call Christina Ladage at 531-4306 for assistance in obtaining All Kids.

Diabetes Outreach meetings

Round Barn and Washington Square Outreach Meetings had total of <u>17</u> people attending. Current victories of their A1c tests were discussed by participants. Then the group moved into steps from small changes to big rewards. Everyone agreed that large resolutions are not easy to follow through. The idea of smaller changes of walking or getting up during TV commercials to start regular activity was appealing. Another challenge that seems doable is making a concerted effort to eat breakfast. We had a more technical discussion on the definition of the Dawn Phenomenon versus the Somogyi Effect to help participants sort out the reason for high a.m. blood glucose. We also discussed the reasons to use targeted blood glucose checks to define a situation.

Living Well With Diabetes

Living Well with Diabetes started with an informational meeting for sign up on September 23rd. 12 residents participated. The meeting will start October 6th for four Tuesdays. 3 participants are enrolled in the interest of supporting a family member.

Community Home Nursing Program offers a skilled nurses assessment and disease management for patients with Diabetes, Hypertension, Coronary Artery Disease, Glaucoma, Cancer, Pain Management, Nutritional, Medication Management and Client Centered education related to disease processes and management.

Tobacco Programs

Project TNT is a 10 session program delivered in 5th grade classes. This program is different from most tobacco education curriculums in that it focuses on changing normative beliefs about the prevalence of tobacco use. Further, instead of just giving participants reasons not to use tobacco, it equips participants with decision-making skills as well as effective communication skills.

SPECIAL EVENTS

Farmer's Market- On September 4th, we held our final Farmer's Market for 2008 at CUPHD. Health Promotion staff distributed recipes for the items that the farmer's had.

Health and Wellness Showcase- On September 25th, we participated in the Showcase by presenting information on our programs, and highlighting the CATCH program at Fisher Grade School. We had interactive nutrition and tobacco trivia. 3,000 attended the showcase.

CATCH training- On September 26th our resident CATCH trainer was invited to McComb to train 2 other schools interested in implementing CATCH.

Smoking Support Group- some of the attendees from our Freedom From Smoking class wanted to continue getting and receiving support from each other, so we have continued to meet, and more people have joined. This program meets on Tuesdays from 5:30 to 6:30 at CUPHD. We currently have 7 participants from the District and the County combined who are at various stages in the quitting process.

Champaign Urbana Public Health District's (CUPHD) Vision Cooperative offers eye exams and eye glasses to people who have Illinois Public Aid as their insurance. CUPHD Vision Cooperative staff act as the gatekeeper to a coalition of area optometrists and an ophthalmologist who have offered to be a part of this great program. By calling the Lens Line (217-531-5367) a person can receive access to an eye exam by one of the participating licensed eye professional provider and access to the CUPHD eye glass program.

Once a person receives an eye exam and a prescription for eye glasses, the Vision Cooperative schedules the person for eye glass fitting and selection. CUPHD has a wide selection of 49 different eye glass frames that are available in different colors. CUPHD Vision Cooperative is able to bill Illinois Public Aid for the eye glasses and lenses; therefore there is no cost to the client for the eye glass frames and lenses.



Illinois Breast and Cervical Cancer (IBCCP) contracts with local medical providers to provide free breast and cervical cancer screening for Illinois women ages 35-64 with no health insurance, Medicaid, or Medicare part B. The CUPHD IBCCP serves women from Champaign, McLean and Vermilion Counties. CUPHD IBCCP provides community outreach as well as educational materials and presentations throughout our service area to encourage all women to have their annual screenings done and to seek new client enrollment in order to provide uninsured screenings for women who would otherwise have no access to theses services. Approximately 40% of the screening tests yield abnormal results requiring IBCCP medical case management and diagnostics services. While women under the age of 35 are not eligible for screening through this program, they may be eligible for medically indicated diagnostic services if referred by their medical provider. If diagnosed, eligible women are transferred into Medicaid for cancer treatment.
