HIV Care Consortium Caseload

The East Central IL HIV Care Consortium (which CUPHD is the Lead Agent for) serves the following counties: Champaign, Clark, Clay, Coles, Crawford, Cumberland, Douglas, Edgar, Effingham, Ford, Iroquois, Jasper, Kankakee, Lawrence, Livingston, Richland & Vermillion.

Of the 25 persons who paid \$7 for Herpes Testing this month between the STD Clinics and Men's Clinics, 4 (16%) persons tested positive for Type II. Staff attempted to contact the clients who test positive for HSV but do not contact CUPHD for results. Staff made attempts to contact 5 (clients from previous month contacted, as well) clients this month with positive results. All were contacted.

Men's Screening Clinic

The clinic uses urine screening for Gonorrhea and Chlamydia, blood testing for HIV and Syphilis, in addition to blood testing for Prostate Cancer screening for men over 40.

Gonorrhea Elimination Project

CUPHD has a new pilot project, the Gonorrhea Elimination Project. In the project, CUPHD staff will follow up with all persons who test positive for gonorrhea in the communities of Champaign, Urbana, and Rantoul. Partner services will be offered to each individual and each of their partners will be contacted and offered testing and treatment for gonorrhea.

In March, 16 persons tested positive for gonorrhea in these communities and follow was attempted to conduct partner services.

Senior Outreach in Champaign-Urbana: CUPHD began providing outreach education and risk reduction services to persons over 50 years old in January 2008. This outreach focuses on educating persons over 50 years old on the signs and symptoms of Sexually Transmitted Diseases and the importance of receiving routine STD testing. Condom distribution is a part of this outreach.

In March, staff conducted these outreach services at 2 different senior high rises (Skelton Place and Washington Square). 6 persons sought services, 5 males and 1 female. 2 were African American and 4 white. 1 persons were tested for gonorrhea/Chlamydia, 2 for HIV, 2 for syphilis, 3 received Hepatitis Vaccination, and 5 men received Prostate Cancer Screening. 12 persons received condom packages. Educational materials were distributed.

In March, we conducted **221 TB Skin Tests**. 2 clients from one of our clinics had a reactive TB Skin Test . The CUPHD TB Control Nurse works with each client who has a reactive TB Skin Test to ensure follow medical care. If the client does not have a physician, the TB Control Nurse coordinates the follow up with Frances Nelson.

Jail Project: Check Out Healthy

Check Out Healthy is a collaborative effort between the Champaign County Correctional Facility and The CUPHD Infectious Disease Division. “Check Out Healthy” is a transitional Case Management Program that offers pre-release support, free communicable disease screening, and discharge planning. The program is offered to all inmates who are HIV+, and those at an increased risk for becoming HIV+ who are housed at the Champaign County Correctional Centers.

“Check Out Healthy” offers all Champaign County Correctional Center inmates a brief, risk behavior assessment. Those identified as being at an increased risk for becoming infected with HIV (men who have sex with men, injection drug users, persons who use crack, methamphetamines, or heroin, persons who are homeless, persons who trade sex for money, drugs, or basic needs, and persons who are victims of domestic violence) will be offered free discharge planning services with referrals to the following community resources:

1. Prevention case management for risk behavior change
2. Housing resources
3. HIV case management
4. Health care

5. Mental Health Services
6. Harm Reduction Services
7. Substance Abuse Treatment/support
8. Methadone Maintenance Therapy
9. Support Groups
10. Domestic Violence Services
11. Employment resources
12. Educational programs

All inmates will be offered the following free communicable disease screening services provided by Champaign-Urbana Public Health District:

1. Urine testing for Chlamydia & gonorrhea
2. A blood test for:
 - a. Syphilis
 - b. HIV
 - c. Hepatitis C (for persons with history of injection drug use)
3. Vaccination for Hepatitis A & B (for persons with Hepatitis C or males with a history of sex with males).

Pregnancy Screening Project

32 women were tested for Gonorrhea and Chlamydia when seeking Pregnancy testing in February. Of those testing, 1 (32%) was positive for Chlamydia and 0 (0%) was positive for gonorrhea.

TIMES Center

Staff from the Division of Infectious Disease Prevention & Management is present at the TIMES Center from 7-8 am on Monday mornings. During the month of March, 24 clients sought TB Skin Testing. An evening clinic was conducted and 7 men sought Prostate Cancer Screening.

Prostate Screening Project

During the month of February, **22 men** over 40 years old were screened through a blood test for Prostate Cancer. Staff conducted these tests through the STD Clinics and mobile outreach projects. A special event was conducted at the TIMES Center on March 26, Salem Baptist Church on March 3, and at Mt. Olive Church on March 14. The church advertised the event and educational materials were distributed.

Juvenile Detention Center Outreach

Staff from CUPHD provides STD skill-based prevention education at the Champaign County Juvenile Detention Center at least one time each month. Urine screening for Chlamydia & Gonorrhea is offered to all of the youth.

In March, 11 clients were tested for gonorrhea & Chlamydia. 1 client tested positive this month for Chlamydia and 0 for gonorrhea (2 results still pending). Of those testing, 9 were African-American, 2 White. 13 were male and 0 female.

CUPHD MOBILE OUTREACH PROGRAM:**Teen Wellness on Wheels (Champaign/Rantoul/Mahomet High Schools)**

Teen WOW was conducted in January at Champaign High School (3 sites), Rantoul High School, and Mahomet High School.

In March, 35 youth were seen on Teen WOW (4 females and 31 males). 24 were African American, 11 were White, and 0 Hispanic.

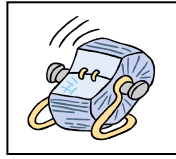
