HIV Care Consortium Caseload

The East Central IL HIV Care Consortium (which CUPHD is the Lead Agent for) serves the following counties: Champaign, Clark, Clay, Coles, Crawford, Cumberland, Douglas, Edgar, Effingham, Ford, Iroquois, Jasper, Kankakee, Lawrence, Livingston, Richland & Vermilion.

Gonorrhea Elimination Project

CUPHD has a new pilot project, the Gonorrhea Elimination Project. In the project, CUPHD staff will follow up with all persons who test positive for gonorrhea in the communities of Champaign, Urbana, and Rantoul. Partner services will be offered to each individual and each of their partners will be contacted and offered testing and treatment for gonorrhea.

In August, **11 clients** were contacted for this service.

Senior Outreach in Champaign-Urbana: CUPHD began providing outreach education and risk reduction services to persons over 50 years old in January 2008. This outreach focuses on educating persons over 50 years old on the signs and symptoms of Sexually Transmitted Diseases and the importance of receiving routine STD testing. Condom distribution is a part of this outreach.

In August, 1 **person** sought services, 1 male and 0 female. 0 were African American, 1 white, and 0 Hispanic. 0 persons were tested for gonorrhea/Chlamydia, 0 for HIV, 0 for syphilis, 0 received Hepatitis Vaccination, 0 persons received flu vaccination and 1 man received Prostate Cancer Screening. 0 persons received condom packages. Educational materials were distributed.

Jail Project: Check Out Healthy

Check Out Healthy is a collaborative effort between the Champaign County Correctional Facility and The CUPHD Infectious Disease Division. “Check Out Healthy” is a transitional Case Management Program that offers pre-release support, free communicable disease screening, and discharge planning. The program is offered to all inmates who are HIV+, and those at an increased risk for becoming HIV+ who are housed at the Champaign County Correctional Centers.

“Check Out Healthy” offers all Champaign County Correctional Center inmates a brief, risk behavior assessment. Those identified as being at an increased risk for becoming infected with HIV (men who have sex with men, injection drug users, persons who use crack, methamphetamines, or heroin, persons who are homeless, persons who trade sex for money,

drugs, or basic needs, and persons who are victims of domestic violence) will be offered free discharge planning services with referrals to the following community resources:

1. Prevention case management for risk behavior change
2. Housing resources
3. HIV case management
4. Health care
5. Mental Health Services
6. Harm Reduction Services
7. Substance Abuse Treatment/support
8. Methadone Maintenance Therapy
9. Support Groups
10. Domestic Violence Services
11. Employment resources
12. Educational programs

All inmates will be offered the following free communicable disease screening services provided by Champaign-Urbana Public Health District:

1. Urine testing for Chlamydia & gonorrhea (Inmates under 30 years old)
2. A blood test for:
 - a. Syphilis
 - b. HIV
 - c. Hepatitis C (for persons with history of injection drug use)
3. Vaccination for Hepatitis A & B (for persons with Hepatitis C or males with a history of sex with males).

In August, **44 clients** (34 African American and 10 white) attended the CDC recommended group prevention and support intervention “VOICES”. This is a one time group prevention session that uses a video to teach condom negotiation and use skills. CUPDH staff began conducting this intervention in the Champaign County jail in September 2008. In February 2010, this intervention was started at the Champaign County Juvenile Detention Center.

Pregnancy Screening Project

16 women were tested for Gonorrhea and Chlamydia when seeking Pregnancy testing in August. Of those testing, 0 (0%) was positive for Chlamydia and 0 (0%) were positive for gonorrhea.

TIMES Center

Staff from the Division of Infectious Disease Prevention & Management is present at the TIMES Center from 7-8 am on Monday mornings to conduct TB Skin Testing and Wednesday mornings from 7-8am to read the skin testing.

During the month of August, **23 clients** sought TB Skin Testing.

Stepping Stones, Salvation Army

We began going to this shelter in May 2010 to conduct TB Skin Testing and HIV/STD testing.

In August, **11 clients** received TB Skin Testing, **0 clients** were tested for HIV/Syphilis, **0** for gonorrhea/Chlamydia, and **0** received Hepatitis vaccinations.

Prostate Screening Project

During the month of August, **8 men** over 40 years old were screened through a blood test for Prostate Cancer. Staff conducted these tests through the STD Clinics and mobile outreach projects.

Juvenile Detention Center Outreach

Staff from CUPHD provides STD skill-based prevention education at the Champaign County Juvenile Detention Center at least one time each month. Urine screening for Chlamydia & Gonorrhea is offered to all of the youth.

In August, **8 clients** were tested for gonorrhea & Chlamydia; **0** were tested syphilis, **0** for HIV, and **0** for Hep C. 2 clients tested positive this month for Chlamydia and 0 for gonorrhea, (3 results still pending). Of those testing, 7 were African-American, 1 White, 0 Hispanic. 6 were male and 2 female.
