Gonorrhea Elimination Project

In the project, CUPHD staff will follow up with all persons who test positive for gonorrhea in the communities of Champaign, Urbana, and Rantoul. Partner services will be offered to each individual and each of their partners will be contacted and offered testing and treatment for gonorrhea.

In July, **7 clients** were contacted for this service.

Communicable Disease*

- One district resident was diagnosed with Cryptosporidiosis.
- One county resident was diagnosed with Giardiasis.
- Two district residents were diagnosed with Salmonellosis.
- There were several reports of potential exposures to rabies and animals sent to the IDPH lab for testing. No positive rabies cases were diagnosed.

In July, the CUPHD TB Control nurse spent several hours working with a client that was eventually diagnosed with Mycobacterium fortuitum rather than tuberculosis.

In July, we conducted **172 TB Skin Tests**

129 of these clients live in Champaign-Urbana
43 in Champaign County
0 in another county

The CUPHD TB Control Nurse works with each client who has a reactive TB Skin Test in a CUPHD clinic to ensure follow medical care. If the client does not have a physician, the TB Control Nurse coordinates the follow up with Frances Nelson.

Jail Project: Check Out Healthy

The Illinois Department of Public Health will not be funding “Check Out Healthy” in SFY 2012 as it has for the past several years. CUPHD management has decided to continue this much needed service as many clients have tested positive for Chlamydia through this project. All inmates who meet the IDPH screening criteria will be offered urine-based testing for gonorrhea and Chlamydia. All inmates who meet screening criteria for HIV testing will be offered this testing as well. All inmates will continue to be screened for syphilis.

VOICES: In July, **11 clients** (11 African American) attended the CDC recommended group prevention and support intervention “VOICES”. This is a one time group prevention session that uses a video to teach condom negotiation and use skills.

Juvenile Detention Center Outreach

Staff from CUPHD provides STD skill-based prevention education at the Champaign County Juvenile Detention Center at least one time each month. Urine screening for Chlamydia & Gonorrhea is offered to all of the youth.

In July, **7 clients** were tested for gonorrhea & Chlamydia; **5** was tested syphilis, **5** for HIV, and **0** for Hep C. 2 clients tested positive this month for Chlamydia and 0 for gonorrhea, (2 results still pending). Of those testing, 6 were African-American, 1 White, 0 Hispanic. 5 were male and 2 female.

Pregnancy Screening Project

7 women were tested for Gonorrhea and Chlamydia when seeking Pregnancy testing in July. Of those testing, 0 (0%) was positive for Chlamydia and 0 (0%) were positive for gonorrhea.

TIMES Center

Staff from the Division of Infectious Disease Prevention & Management is present at the TIMES Center from 7-7:30 am on Monday mornings to conduct TB Skin Testing and Wednesday mornings from 7-7:30 am to read the skin testing.

During the month of July, **17 clients** sought TB Skin Testing.

Stepping Stones, Salvation Army

Staff from the Division of Infectious Disease Prevention & Management is present at the TIMES Center from 7:30-8 am on Monday mornings to conduct TB Skin Testing and Wednesday mornings from 7:30-8am to read the skin testing.

In July, **7 clients** received TB Skin Testing.

Center for Women in Transition

Staff from the Division of Infectious Disease Prevention & offer TB skin testing to residents at CWIT, as needed.

During the month of July, **8** received TB Skin Testing.
