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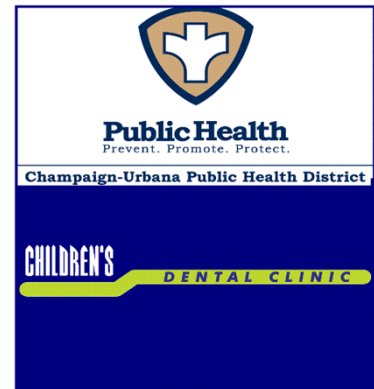
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CUPHD Dental Program

Champaign-Urbana Public Health District's Champaign Dental Clinic provides a Dental Home for children with All Kids who are residents of Champaign or Urbana. Appointments are available Monday - Friday, 8am - 4pm with Emergency and Urgent Care appointments also available. Parents are encouraged to schedule dental visits after their child's first birthday. The clinic is staffed by a dentist and 2 hygienists, however, beginning February 1st the patient case load required that we increase to 2 dentists on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

Mobile Program/School Sealants

January: Visited 4 Schools - 166 Exams, 91 Cleanings, 90 Fluorides, 257 Sealants placed.
February: Visited 6 Schools - 134 Exams, 71 Cleanings, 71 Fluorides, 114 Sealants placed.
March: Visited 2 Schools - 72 Exams, 36 Cleanings, 36 Fluorides, 25 Sealants placed.
April: Visited 3 Schools - 103 Exams, 66 Cleanings, 66 Fluorides, 118 Sealants placed.

The School Sealant Program does not see patients during the months of May, June, July and August. It will continue when school starts back up in September.

September: Visited 4 Schools - 228 Exams, 95 Cleanings, 96 Fluorides, 200 Sealants placed.
October: Visited 4 Schools - 281 Exams, 121 Cleanings, 121 Fluorides, 216 Sealants placed.

After we test the stores, we send congratulatory letters if they pass, as well as notices of failure. This is in cooperation with local law enforcement. Vendors are checked for compliance 3 times per year.

Events

There was a presentation on Smoke Free Parks by the Girl Scouts to the board and 30 people attended. The Girl Scouts were also featured on WCIA 3 News talking about Smoke Free Parks.

Nick (our WHP Intern) attended the UIUC housing fair on Smoke-Free Multi-Unit Housing and we served 30 people.

Tara attended the Parkland Health Fair and talked to 60 people.

We set up an informational table with Teen Pregnancy Prevention information and resource guides for parents at the Parent/Teacher conferences at Franklin Middle School. 7 people took information.

Talia finished up Be Proud! Be Responsible! with the 8th grade students at Franklin Middle School for PREP. 53 students participated.

Jennifer finished Draw the Line/Respect the Line with 6th grade students at J.W. Eater Junior High School in Rantoul for PREP. 46 students attended this semester.

Jennifer also finished Be Proud! Be Responsible with the 8th grade students at J.W. Eater Junior High School. 43 students were in that program this time.

Illinois Breast & Cervical Cancer Program (IBCCP)

IBCCP contracts with local medical providers to provide free breast and cervical cancer screening for Illinois women ages 35-64 with no health insurance, Medicaid, or Medicare part B. The CUPHD IBCCP serves women from Champaign, McLean and Vermilion Counties. CUPHD IBCCP provides community outreach as well as educational materials and presentations throughout our service area to encourage all women to have their annual screenings done and to seek new client enrollment in order to provide uninsured screenings for women who would otherwise have no access to these services. Approximately 40% of the screening tests yield abnormal results requiring IBCCP medical case management and diagnostics services. While women under the age of 35 are not eligible for screening through this program, they may be eligible for medically indicated diagnostic services if referred by their medical provider. If diagnosed, eligible women are transferred into Medicaid for cancer treatment.

Staff visited 61 businesses (i.e. gas stations, restaurants, hotels, taverns, salons, etc.) in Champaign County, 59 businesses in Vermilion County, and 10 in McLean county to hang IBCCP informational fliers and discuss our program with the employees at the businesses.

Our agency participated in 3 health fairs for African-American women and the American Cancer Society *Making Strides* walk in champaign-Urbana. We reached a total of 920 women at these events. Six contracted providers were given a presentation on IBCCP and provided with enrollment materials for their patients.

Due to decreased funding, our IBCCP agency has been placed on a "Priority List" with the state. This restricts the first-served clients to those with abnormalities. Those clients in need of only screening services are placed on a wait list until monies for standard screening services are available. Clients maintain enrollment in our program but may need to wait several months before our program can case manage and pay for their screening services.
