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CUPHD Dental Program

Champaign-Urbana Public Health District's Champaign Dental Clinic provides a Dental Home for children with All Kids who are residents of Champaign or Urbana. Appointments are available Monday - Friday, 8am - 4pm with Emergency and Urgent Care appointments also available. Parents are encouraged to schedule dental visits after their child's first birthday. The clinic is staffed by a dentist and 2 hygienists, however, beginning February 1st the patient case load required that we increase to 2 dentists on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

 March: Visited 4 Schools - 124 Exams, 56 Cleanings, 56 Fluorides, 13 Sealants placed.
 April: Visited 3 Schools - 148 Exams, 78 Cleanings, 77 Fluorides, 151 Sealants placed.

The School Sealant Program does not see patients during the months of May, June, July and August.

A tobacco sales compliance program. We notify all tobacco vendors that we will check for compliance with minimum age laws. After we test the stores, we send congratulatory letters if they pass, as well as notices of failure. This is in cooperation with local law enforcement. Vendors are checked for compliance 3 times per year.

Lexi Palacios attended the Youth in Transition conference on November 16th and presented information about general health and safety to 60 people.

Illinois Breast & Cervical Cancer Program (IBCCP)

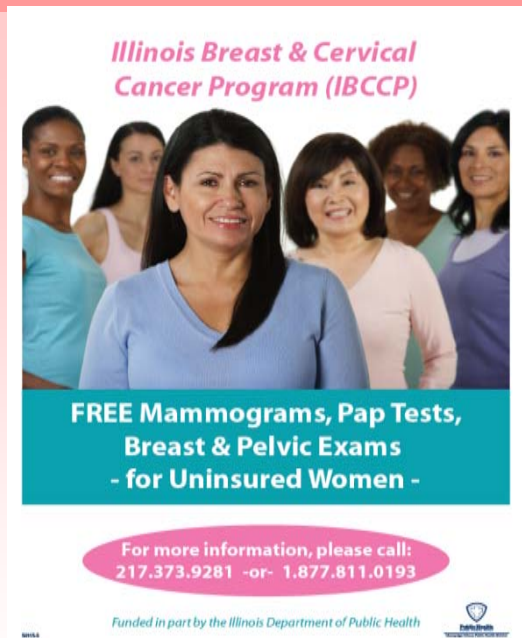
IBCCP contracts with local medical providers to provide free breast and cervical cancer screening for Illinois women ages 35-64 with no health insurance, Medicaid, or Medicare part B. The CUPHD IBCCP serves women from Champaign, McLean and Vermilion Counties. CUPHD IBCCP provides community outreach as well as educational materials and presentations throughout our service area to encourage all women to have their annual screenings done and to seek new client enrollment in order to provide uninsured screenings for women who would otherwise have no access to these services. Approximately 40% of the screening tests yield abnormal results requiring IBCCP medical case management and diagnostics services. While women under the age of 35 are not eligible for screening through this program, they may be eligible for medically indicated diagnostic services if referred by their medical provider. If diagnosed, eligible women are transferred into Medicaid for cancer treatment.

IBCCP continues to identify the largest referral source to our program comes from medical provider offices. We focused our outreach to the provider offices so that they continue to spread the word about IBCCP. We spent 3 days at the Mexican Consulate in Urbana where we provided program information and breast health education. We continue to focus on transitioning PMW clients into our caseload.

The number of active IBCCP clients continues to increase in all counties except Vermilion where the majority of the clients transferred to Medicaid. We are discharging fewer than 5 women a month to Medicaid/ACA.
